My Dear Husband:-

Can't tell you how much I appreciated your good letter of the 30<sup>th</sup>. It helped me to feel so much better. I had got - so I could hardly see any bright side any more, & certainly hope the Holly Ridge job, turns out better with less trouble and expense, than the others have. I have been thinking of asking you to send me regular, about every two weeks the money you can spare us, & don't like to have to write asking every time I need some. You need not think it will go any faster than necessary, and if you send more than we need just at the time & will save it, for bills are extra at school closing, also we will have to try to save a few hundred extra for fall buying this year, as we are all at home going to have our clothes shoes etc just about cleaned up before summer is over.

and it will be new books all around again.  
 am going to see Bennett about selling  
 our lumber. A.D. doesn't have time to  
 do things for his own wife, ha!

They are counting on starting the new church  
 in May. I mean to put all we get  
 for the lumber in the church. may keep  
 part of the oak. I have engaged two  
 pigs. don't want to feel so starved for pork  
 and sausage next year. And will need some  
 money to pay for them in about two weeks.  
 Fred is repairing the pasture fence.

I received your clothes, but will not  
 get them back to you before the last of  
 next week. Gertrude seemed to be better  
 for more than two weeks she didn't  
 have any nervous spell, but she had  
 two last week, & haven't had her to the  
 Dr yet. Write as often as you can.  
 let me know how all is going.

There is not much news reaches  
 me. I am expecting to begin going  
 to preaching sunday. This certainly is  
 like spring for groundhog day.

Fred is gone to basket-ball. Wish you could be here for a while now, so we could talk of the things that would take to much time and space to write. Since my health is below normal, it may be I have been blue too much, the weakness about my heart has been worse than it ever was, and ales my back. Norman is so lively. Polly & Dimp<sup>\*</sup> were proud of their dinner and motor.

The girls are all gone to bed and I guess I will soon, it is lonesome for me. I want to thank you for the nice letter. Love lightens labor. If I could feel sure always that you love me as I do you, I don't think I would be easy to get blues. Guess Mr Blalock will save? Is Parter still in jail? With best wishes and lots of love
